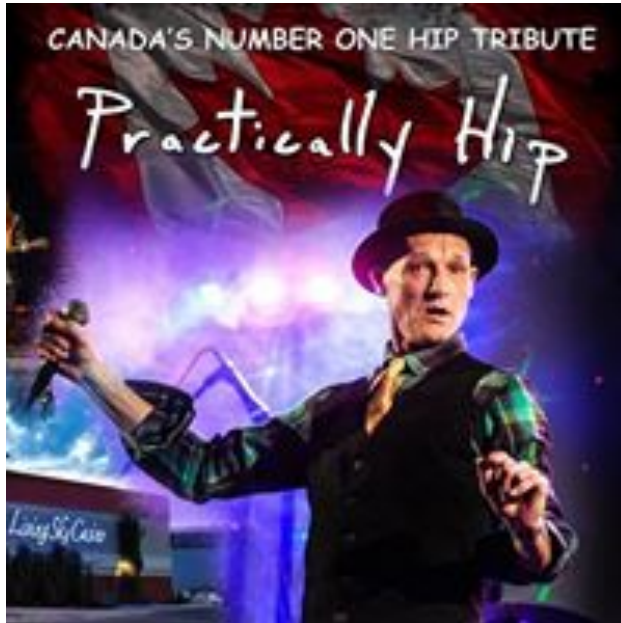


Practically Canada Day - Practically Hip Concert

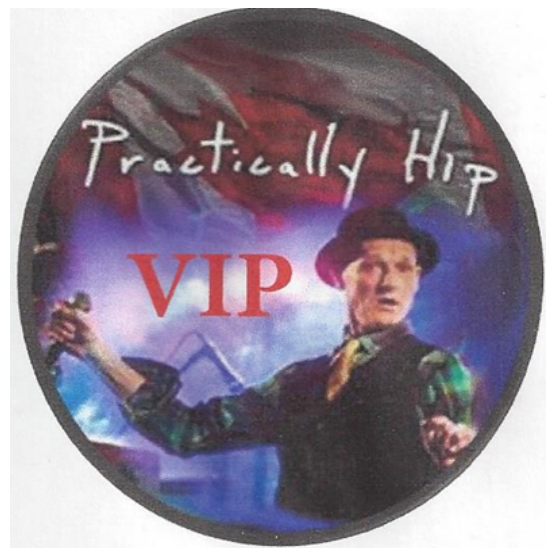
